- On February 26, 2024 the Government of Nova Scotia did not proclaim the Coastal Protection Act. Instead, private property owners and 49 municipal governments were given the responsibility to protect our coastline.
- Neither the municipalities nor private property owners have the expertise to protect our coast. Only the province can provide the scientific and financial resources to design and enforce effective regulations and by-laws that will protect our shores

THEREFORE we, the residents of Nova Scotia, call upon the Government of Nova Scotia to proclaim the Coastal Protection Act and complete the associated Regulations to ensure consistent enforcement of the provisions set out in the Act.

The government has now shirked that responsibility and placed the burden on the 49 Municipalities that do not have the resources or expertise to develop new by-laws. This could take years. - An actual address is not needed. A postal code or community name is enough.
